Georgetown High School hosted their prom April 23

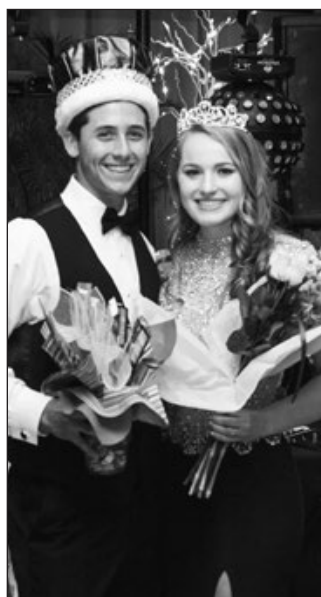
and named Spencer Rabb and Sydney May as their King and Queen.
